Anthony Hall called the meeting to order at 6:45. The minutes for February were presented. An addition was suggested and accepted to revise the minutes showing a new budget committee was created. Vic Koenig made a motion to accept, and Roland Boles seconded. Vic Koenig presented the Treasurer's report, with revenues from dues of \$411, and outlays of \$248 for taxes, AMA rechartering, and clerical. There is a \$15,239 balance remaining.

We will be doing a demo at Town Acres on 4/15. Contact Doug Lindaur if you would like to help out. John Sevier Middle School's STEM program will be at the field for a demo on 6/23; it will be 7th and 9th graders.

Anthony Hall is tracking down an inexpensive shed for the lower area as well as a charging station.

During the year, we will be doing events involving night flying, quad racing, combat league and other activities. HobbyTown will be stocking motors and speed controls for the bloody baron model.

The 12 yr old with the Wise Make-A-Wish foundation is getting an RC sim, and Hobbytown is working with Horizon Hobby to get a helicopter donated.

Doug Lindaur discussed the options in getting a new weather station. The vantage Vue is older tech but cheaper at \$300. The Vantage Pro is a newer model, and has more options, including a remote wind sensor and heat shield for the thermometer, but is priced at \$650. A poll showed most preferred the Pro, but there were concerns that it might not be worth the added cost. Anthony Hall will look into this and collect more information.

Joel Tester was awarded the All Season Flyer patch.

At 7:45, there was a motion to close made by Craig Quillen, and seconded by Vic Koenig.
