Servo Installation -

So, the little brass bushings that insert in the rubber grommets are mounted with the flat side down. You all probably know this, but I think I built a couple of kits before I learned it. It seems at first glance that the bigger end would fit against the screw head, but doing this would drive the sharp open end into the mounting surface and prevent the rubber from isolating vibrations

> My hands are getting older and stiffer and those little bushing are hard to insert with my fingers.

I've found that putting them on an awl (hole punch), and then pushing them into the rubber grommet makes the work a lot easier, and I don't break any fingernails.

For Sale-Slow Poke -

Durafly Slow Poke from Hobby King. I've had this plane a few years, but only just put it together over the winter. It is still in production and replacement parts are available (not that you would need them). I built a Balsa version of this plane many years ago and it was a nice gentle flyer. I've had this one out to the field twice, and it is not "slow and gentle". I've not crashed it, but have not been successful in getting the balance and throws just right. I really like the looks of this plane, and if I had the room, I'd keep it. Includes Motor, ESC, and DSM2/DSMX Receiver.
