I interviewed Doyle Blevins for the November newsletter and here is a little bit about him.

I started building free flight model airplanes when I was in my single digits of life. My parents would buy them for me and encouraged me to see if I could get them to fly. I wanted an RC model too but my parents would always say NO! They would say you will need to join a club and we do not have time for that.

So after I got married I bought my first RC airplane. It was a Flitecraft Cardinal 3. I purchased it in 1993 then joined AMA in 1994. I didn't get to fly it until fall of 1995 at the airport just passed Spruce Pine N.C. called Avery County/Morrison Airport , it is a non-controlled airspace airport. I helped start a club there and was there for 12 years just flying RC models.

In 1999 I went to an indoor free flight contest at ETSU (East Tennessee State University). There I started flying more and more free flight models again. I would compete in Unlimited Rubber speed, Peanut scale, Penny planes, E Z B. and Bostonian. Each model had their own set of rules. I have a book of the rules for reference if anyone needs them. My best flight with a Penny plane was 9 minutes 49 seconds.

The EZB was 7 minutes 23 seconds, in 2017. All the events are who flies the longest but Unlimited Rubber is who can fly the fastest, around a 20 foot circle. My best was 7.53 seconds and was beat by Walter Collins with 6.54 if I remember right in 2012. I do play the Bass Guitar, Ukulele, Harmonica and Trumpet. I played the Trumpet through Middle and High School, 6 grade to 12. I also love Roller Skating and was a floor monitor for 10 years when my daughter went skating.

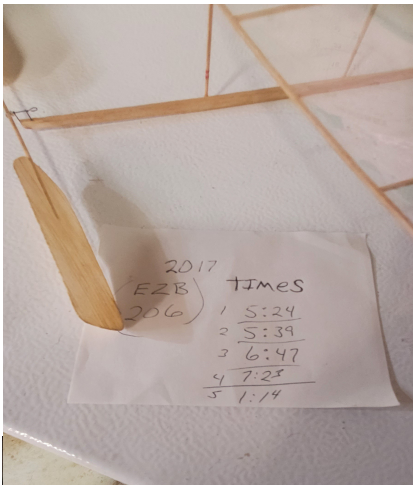
